BAPTISMS:

Baptism is celebrated on the First and Third Saturdays of each month. Parents are required to complete the Baptism preparation program prior to scheduling the Baptism. An interview with the Director of Faith Formation is necessary before beginning the Baptism sessions.

Archdiocesan Regulations require that notice of intended marriage be made six months prior to the date of the marriage. Pre-nuptial instructions are required for marriage. Contact the Rectory for location.

Communion to the sick and Anointing of the Sick will be given upon request of someone who is ill, having surgery, or preparing for death. Emergency sick calls for the dying may be made at any time.

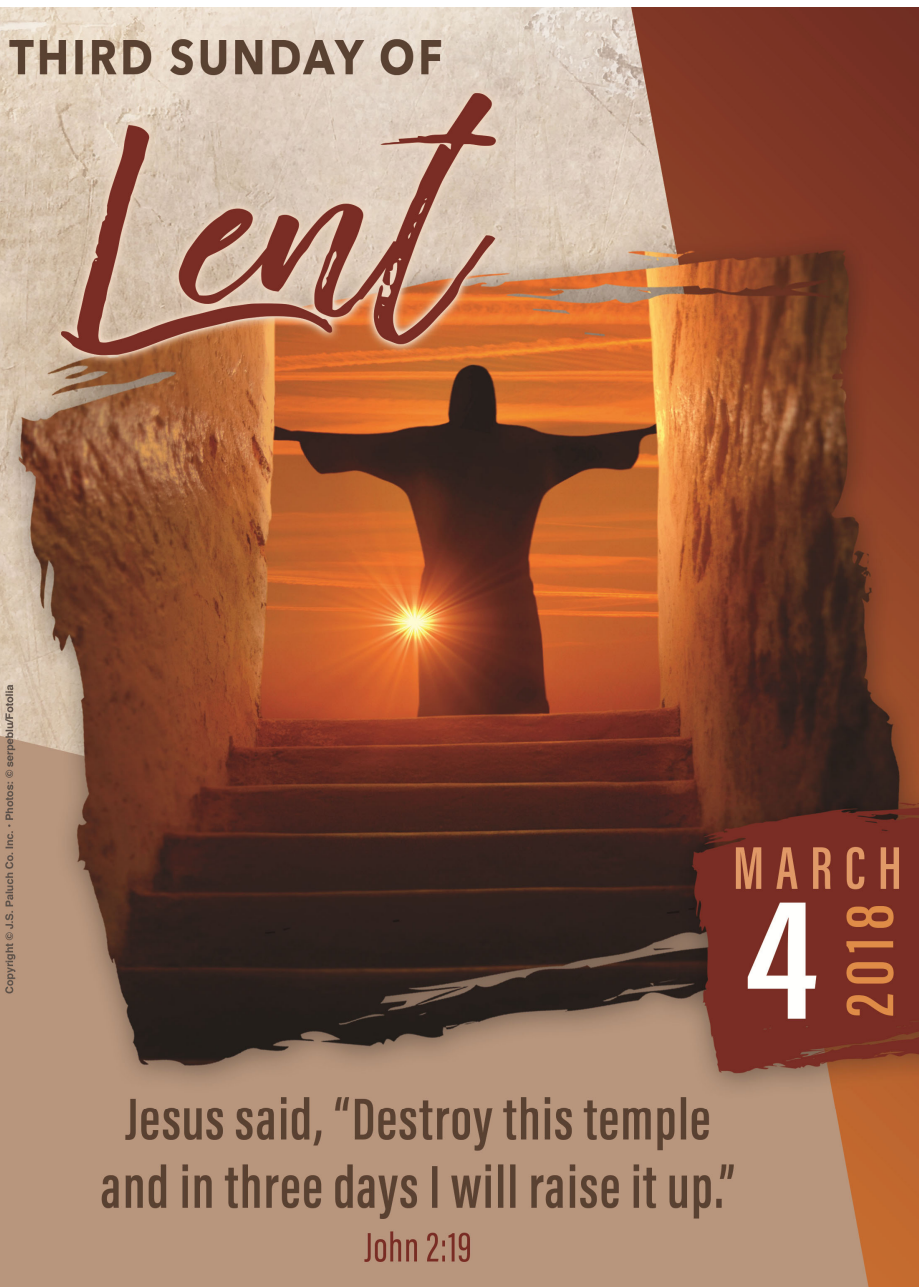

Guidelines for Fasting and Abstinence during Lent:

Ash Wednesday and **Good Friday** are obligatory days of **fasting and abstinence** for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading — God gives the law through Moses (Exodus 20:1-17 [1-3, 7-8, 12-17]) *or Exodus 17:3-7.*

Psalm — Lord, you have the words of everlasting life (Psalm 19) *or Psalm 95.*

Second Reading — We proclaim Christ crucified (1 Corinthians 1:22-25) *or Romans 5:1-2, 5-8.*

Gospel — Many began to believe in Jesus' name when they saw the signs he was doing (John 2:13-25) *or John 4:5-42 [5-15, 19b-26, 39a, 40-42].*

READINGS FOR SUNDAY, MARCH 11

First Reading — The wrath and the mercy of the LORD are revealed in the exile and liberation of the Chosen People (2 Chronicles 36:14-16, 19-23) *or 1 Samuel 16:1b, 6-7, 10-13a.*

Psalm — Let my tongue be silenced, if I ever forget you! (Psalm 137) *or Psalm 23.*

Second Reading — God, who is rich in mercy, brought us to life with Christ (Ephesians 2:4-10) *or Ephesians 5:8-14.*

Gospel — The Son of Man must be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life (John 3:14-21) *or John 9:1-41 [1, 6-9, 13-17, 34-38].*

COMMUNAL RESPONSIBILITY

The people of God forgot the covenant and flouted God's laws. They did not listen to the prophets among them, who spoke for God in warning them. Prophets are sent from God to remind us why we are here, but they are often, even in our own time, mocked, disregarded, and mistreated rather than thanked and listened to.

The book of Chronicles tells the results of these sins: the destruction of the temple and all of Jerusalem, murder, mayhem, and finally exile to a foreign land. Why are these stories in the Bible? Just to inform us of what happened to our ancient forebears? What good would that be unless there were a message and a warning for us as well? Are we people who follow the teachings of God, who obey the words of Christ in the second covenant in his blood? Or do we continue to wreak works of darkness and violence? We are reminded by these readings that we will be judged as a people, not just as individuals.

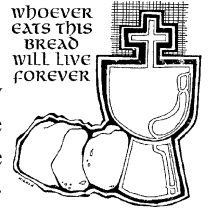

R.C.I.A. NEWS

Queen of the Universe begins the celebration of the Scrutinies at the 9:30 Mass this weekend. When we scrutinize something, we look at it or examine it carefully. The rites called Scrutinies reflect this examination. We look within ourselves to find anything that keeps us from Jesus. Then we look to Jesus to heal those weaknesses and strengthen us to face further temptations.

Readings from the Gospel of John will we read at the Masses celebrating the Scrutinies. (9:30 on 3/4; the 11:30 on 3/11; and the 9:30 on 3/18).

This week, the story of the Samaritan woman at the well illustrates how difficult it is to come to Jesus in faith. Jesus asks the Samaritan woman for a drink. The woman comments, sarcastically, "How can you a Jew ask me, a Samaritan woman for a drink?" For Jesus, "living water" refers to the water of life, the water that will satisfy the thirst of the mind, body and soul and not just for an hour or two but forever.

Lent calls us to a serious renewal of our baptismal promises. Are we giving witness to the gospel? Lent is a time to meet Christ at the well, to be renewed in the living water of his Spirit. Please continue to pray for all Queen parishioners on the RCIA journey!

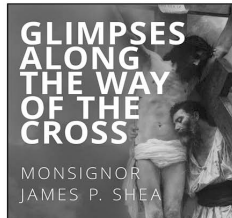

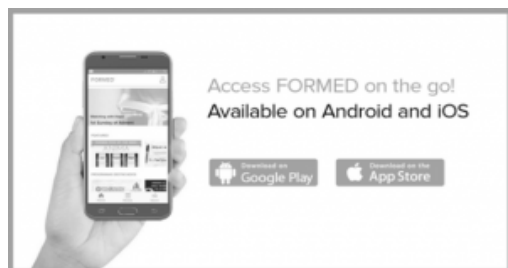

On Wednesday, March 7 we continue our study *“Welcome to the Holy Land”* by spending our time together in the Galilee.
